

Notice of Race 2005 RHODES FORMULA WINDSURFING EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIP



Ialisos, Rhodes, Greece.

June 5th to June 12th, 2005

An International Windsurfing Association sanctioned event

1. EVENT

- **1.1** The 2005 **RHODES** EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS will be held from Sunday June 5th to Sunday June 12th 2005 in Ialisos, Rhodes, Greece.
- **1.2** The Event is a Qualification Regatta, in the Mens Division, for the 2005 Formula Windsurfing World Championships. A total of 5 qualification places are allocated to European competitors in the European Championships. The event is also a **Level 1** Formula Windsurfing **World Ranking** event.

2. ORGANISER

- **2.1** The Championships will be organised by the RHODES WINDSURFING ACADEMY as the Local Organising Authority (LOA) for and on behalf of, and under specified conditions laid down by, the IFWC and the ISAF.
- 2.2 The event is sponsored by Ministry of Tourism & Municipality of Ialisos.

3. VENUE

- 3.1 The event will be based at the Rhodes Windsurfing, Academy Ferenikis Str, Ialisos, Rhodes.
- **3.2** Conditions to be expected west and North west / sideshore and side-onshore.

4. RULES

- **4.1** This is an ISAF sanctioned event governed by:
- 4.1.1 The 2005/2008 Racing Rules of Saling (RRS), and Appendix B Windsurfing;
- 4.1.2 The IFWC Class Rules & Championship Rules;
- 4.1.3 This Notice of Race (NoR) & the Sailing Instructions (SIs).
- **4.1.4** Alterations to the SIs must be approved by the Class's Race Supervisor.
- 4.2 Competitors shall attend the opening & closing ceremonies , including the dinner and prize giving.
- **4.3** The IFWC is a category 'C' class as set out in ISAF Regulation 20 Advertising Code.
- 4.4 Competitors shall be accommodated a the Forum Beach Hotels (event sponsor) adjacent to race site.

5. ELIGIBILITY & DISCIPLINE

- **5.1** All entries shall meet the requirements of ISAF Regulation 19 Eligibility Code.
- **5.2** A minimum of 3 races is required for a valid Championship.
- **5.3** Competitors shall possess valid third party liability insurance.
- **5.4** Competitors shall be a member of a National FW Association, or of the IFWC. National Associations shall be paid up members of the IWA, which is empowered by the class to collect any fees due.
- **5.5** Membership formalities can be completed on site.

6. CLASSES

6.1 Formula Windsurfing European Championship (FWEC)

- **6.1.1** The series shall be a single discipline 'Open Entry' event for men and women in Divisions A and B;
- **6.1.2** Women shall race separately from the Men.
- **6.1.3** There shall be a maximum of 4 races per day. The maximum number of races in the series is 15.
- **6.2** Masters men shall race with Division A.
- **6.3** Youth men may race with Division A or separately, depending upon the number of entries.

7. DIVISIONS

- 7.1 Gender: Men (A); Women (B).
- 7.2 Age:
- 7.2.1 A youth shall be under the age of 20 (born in or after 1986 and not later than 1993)
- 7.2.2 A Master is a man who has reached the age of 35 (1969>) or a woman who has reached the age of 30 (1974>)
- **7.2.3** A competitor shall have reached the minimum age, in the relevant division, by Dec.31st 2004.
- **7.2.4** A competitor shall not be older than the maximum age limit, in the relevant division, by Dec 31st 2005.
- 7.3 Weight:
- **7.3.1 Lightweight -** a sailor who weighs less than 80kg.
- 7.3.2 Heavyweight a sailor who weighs more than 75kg.
- **7.4** A minimum of 5 entries is required to constitute a division within a fleet.

8. EQUIPMENT

8.1 All competitors shall bring their own equipment.

9. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- **9.1** It is the responsibility of each competitor to ensure that his/her board and equipment conforms to the Class Rules
- **9.2** The equipment inspectors will pay special attention to sail identification rule compliance.
- **9.3** Equipment checks may be made throughout the event.

10. SAIL INSIGNIAS

10.1 National letters & sail numbers shall be in a colour that contrasts strongly with the body of the sail; placed immediately above the event advertising; and positioned according to RRS App. G. Alternatively sail insignias may be placed back to back on a white background. All Sails shall otherwise comply with the national letter system according to the RRS 77 and App. G.

11. BUOYANCY

11.1 If personal buoyancy is prescribed, each competitor & support boat crewmember shall wear, above the waist, a jacket, harness, or vest with a minimum buoyancy of 4kg uninflated, in fresh water. The buoyancy shall be tested with a ferrous metal weight of 4kg., which shall remain supported for a minimum of 5 minutes.

12. LIABILITY

- 12.1 Competitors take part in all races at their own risk. The LOA, IFWC or any of their officials or representatives or the sponsors or their officials or representatives are not responsible, under any circumstances, for any damage, loss or injury either ashore or on the water either to persons or equipment, which may result. Participation in this event, supporting events and in each race in them is at the sole discretion of the sailor and at his/her own risk.
- 12.2 All competitors, officials and media will be required to sign a 'Port Police Waiver of Responsibility'.

13. COURSES

13.1 Courses shall be as prescribed in the IFWC Championship Rules or in the Sailing Instructions.

14. SCORING

14.1 The RRS low points scoring system shall apply.

15. INTERNATIONAL JURY

15.1 An International Jury will be appointed in accordance with the RRS 70.4. Their decisions will be final and cannot be appealed.

16. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SI)/EVENT PROGRAMME

16.1 The 'Championship SIs' will be available at registration, as will the Event Programme scheduling social events.

17. COACHES

- 17.1 Coaches are required to register in advance by filling in FORM 4.
- **17.2** Coach boats may support competitors. If you propose to bring your own, please advise the local organisers in advance.
- 17.3 Coaches shall wear buoyancy aids when the "Y" flag is flown.

19. MEDALS AND PRIZES

- 19.1 Medals or trophies may be awarded up to the first five competitors in the Championship, including Youth and Masters, Light and Heavy, depending on entry numbers. Prize categories and the actual number of prizes to be awarded in each properly constituted division will be posted on the official notice board after the close of registration.
- 19.2 The first European man/ woman in the FWEC shall be known as the Formula European Champion.
- 19.3 The first European youth in the FWEC shall be known as the Formula Youth European Champion.
- 19.4 The first European master in the FWEC shall be known as the Formula Masters European Champion.
- **19.4** These Championships carry a prize fund of **20,000 euro** (net of taxes), which shall be divided according to Prize Money rules published on the formula website.

20. DRUGTESTING

20.1 Competitors are reminded of the ISAF rules and regulations concerning the use of banned methods and substances. Drug testing may take place during the event.

21. TELEVISION AND MEDIA

21.1 In registering for the event, competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority the right in perpetuity to make, use and show from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproduction of them, taken during the period of the event, for the said Championship as defined in the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions in which he/she participates without compensation.

22. BIBS/VESTS & COMPETITORS SAIL BRANDING.

22.1 During racing, competitors may be required by the organisers to wear bibs/vests carrying the event sponsors' branding; and carry the event sponsor's advertising on their sails. The maximum size of the event-advertising sticker is 600mmX1000mm. The stickers may not be cut or trimmed in any way.

23. DRESS CODE

- 23.1 Smart casual clothes shall be worn for the Opening Ceremony and Prize Giving Ceremony.
- **23.2** The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to anyone whose standard of attire is not commensurate with the occasion.

24. ACCOMMODATION

- **24.1** The **Forum Beach Hotel (FBH)** is an official sponsor of the event. FBH offer competitors, their families and support personnel a range of subsidised accommodation. Included in the package is breakfast, lunch and evening meal.
- 24.2 All competitors are required to stay at FBH. A booking form is attached with this Notice of Race.

25. AIR TRAVEL/TRANSPORTATION/TRANSFERS

- **25.1** A wide range of scheduled and charter flights are available from all over Europe .
- 25.2 Flights are direct to Rhodes from many European cities , or via Athens to Rhodes at subsidised rates.
- **25.3** The RWA will arrange transport to and from the airport /ferries for equipment ,competitors and support personnel free of charge.
- **25.5** Ferries to Rhodes are regularly scheduled from port of Pireus, Athens.

26. REGISTRATION

26.1 The registration office during the regatta will situated adjacent to RWA.

- **26.2** Competitors will be required to produce the following prior to completing registration formalities on site:
 - Original Regatta Entry Form (Form 1)
 - Evidence of valid third party insurance
 - Parental/legal Guardian Assent (Form 2) for those under age of 18
 - Medical Treatment Permission (Form 3) for those under age of 18 or on their parents medical insurance policy
 - Original Bank Transfer/Draft details
 - Proof of age
 - Equipment Registration Form signed by the Official Inspector

27. ENTRIES & PAYMENT

- **27.1** The entry fees are as stated on the attached entry form (Form 1) and shall be paid at the time of entry by MasterCard, Visa Card or bank transfer only. The cut-off date for pre-entries is MAY 5th, 2005.
